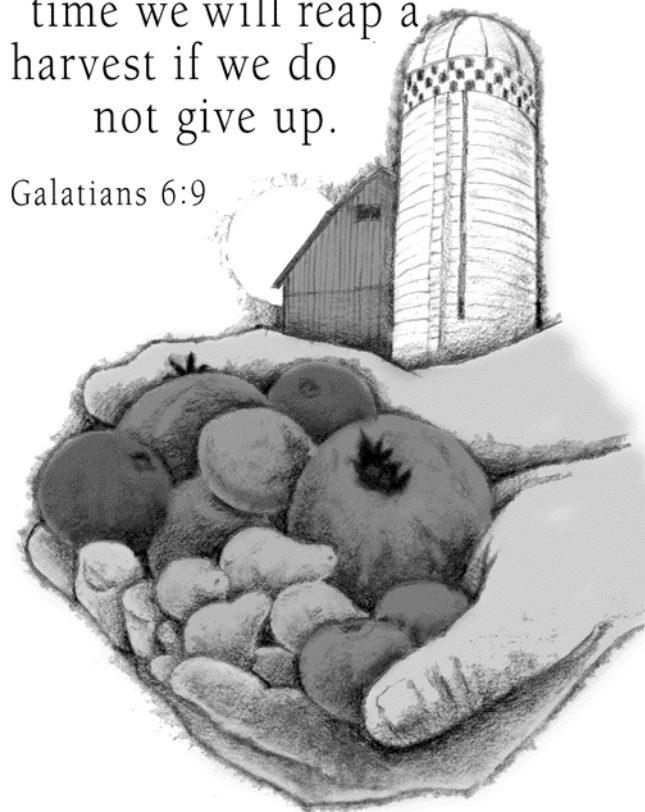

Secretaries report was approved

Jean Evans gave the financial report which reflected we are about \$6,000 ahead of last year in giving. Missions giving is current. We expect apportionments to be paid in full. Pledges to date are \$158,177 with an overall increase of \$2,196 from last year.

Missions Committee gave their report and it was discussed that a meal would be hosted by the youth before the Community Thanksgiving Service on November 20th from 5-6:30 p.m.

Worship Committee gave their report.

Pastor Dave discussed the website as well as how time and talent surveys can be accessed online.

The kid's recreation league, Upward Sports, was discussed and it has not begun. It was concluded that Rec League participation may be down.

The community garden was discussed and fifty families were recorded to have signed up at the Fellowship Cup. Noon Rotary has donated \$1,000 for seeds and supplies. It was decided that this will also be part of an Eagle Scout Project.

The Scouts program was discussed and it was made known that a new charter signed with Cub Scout Pack 28. There are now 40 boys. The God and Life program has begun with 12 Boy Scouts. Religious life programs are available for Cub Scouts and Girl Scouts. Volunteers with Sunday School teaching experience are recommended.

Meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

Manning Lecture Series

Joy Carroll grew up in the inner-city of South London, England, where her father was an Anglican priest. In 1978, she spent a year working in Haiti with a relief and rehabilitation mission, before returning home to train to be a teacher. After qualifying with a Bachelor of Education, she taught for three years before following a call to train in the ministry in the Anglican Church of England. Joy was one of the first women to be ordained as a priest in England in 1994 and as the youngest elected clergy member of the General Synod was able to speak on behalf of women and others marginalized by church and society. Her ministry in inner-city parishes embraced the needs of the poor, the homeless, the mentally ill, families and the elderly.

Joy is a gifted preacher and communicator. In 1995, the BBC Everyman series made a documentary to mark the first anniversary of the ordination of women to the priesthood. They profiled Joy’s work in inner-city London and highlighted the new dimensions that women priests are bringing into the church. Joy was also the advisor to British writer Richard Curtis, as well as the inspiration and role model for his hit situation comedy series “The Vicar of Dibley,” starring Dawn French

This year’s Manning Lecture series will be Thursday, February 9th at 11:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. in the Iowa Wesleyan College Chapel Auditorium.

1st UMC of Mt. Pleasant will also be hosting a series of movie viewings featuring “The Vicar of Dibley.” Movie nights will take place on January 12th, 19th, 26th and February 2nd at 7:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall.

Your Pledge to Missions Supports Missionaries

First United Methodist Church of Mt. Pleasant was privileged this weekend to host medical missionaries Drs. Lynn and Sharon Fogleman. Dr. Sharon has Mt. Pleasant connections as she is the daughter of Dr. Richard and Marti Goodwin, former superintendent of Mt. Pleasant Schools. The Foglemans have been working as family practice doctors at the Red Bird Mission Clinic in Kentucky for the past 14 years. 1st UMC has been supporting the Foglemans for many years and are committed to continual support as they move into a new assignment in Africa. They expect to leave for South Sudan, the newest country in the world, by late February after more training.

This past weekend, the Foglemans made presentations at each worship service. During the Sunday School hour, the Missions Committee served a breakfast buffet while the Foglemans shared more specifically about the assignment in South Sudan. The love offering to assist the Foglemans in this transition time totaled \$1,772.00.

Our annual \$1,800 mission pledge to the Fogleman's work makes it possible for Lynn and Sharon to train village personnel to serve the medical needs of their own villages so hygiene, immunization, safe child births and health education will continue in the villages long after missionary doctors leave the area.

District Learning Event

First United Methodist Church of Mt. Pleasant will be the host for our Southeast District annual learning event on Sunday, January 29, 2012 from 2:30 to 5:00 p.m.

Workshops will be offered for many of the committees of the local church, including Staff Parish Relations, Finance, Trustees, and the Church Ad Council. Participants will be introduced to the basic roles of each committee. New leaders and members of these committees are especially invited to attend.

The New Year is upon us and if you haven't heard it yet, you are sure to hear it soon; have you made New Year's Resolutions? People often start the year, hoping to make changes in their lives: eat better, exercise more, stop smoking, spend more time with family, read the Bible more, swear less, and the list goes on. However, most tend to quickly disregard these resolutions.
